Your dog underwent a castration today. This entailed removing his testicles through a small incision in front of his scrotum

Post Surgical Care for Dog Castrations:

- Keep your dog quiet for the next few days. No excessive activities such as running or jumping. This may cause excess swelling.
- Your dog was treated with an injectable pain medication that lasts 8-10 hours. We are sending home pain medication for you to start giving tonight.
- Please keep your dog from licking the incision. If he does, please call so we can send home an e-collar.
- There are no external sutures to remove.
- Don't worry if his appetite is not as good as before, it may take a day or two for him to eat his regular amount of food.
- Watch the incision site for any redness, swelling or oozing. If this occurs contact Dr. Oursler or her staff immediately.
- Watch for any change in the color of his gums, they should be a nice pink tone. If at any time they become pale or white call immediately. This could mean that your dog is bleeding internally.
