Your dog underwent an Ovariohysterectomy, or spay, today. This entailed removing her ovaries & uterus.

Post Surgical Care for Dog Spays:

- Keep your dog quiet for the next few days. No excessive activities such as running or jumping. **Do not allow your dog to lick the incision.** This may cause surgical sutures to come undone.
- Don't worry if her appetite is not as good as before, it may take a day or two for her to eat her regular amount of food.
- There are no external sutures to remove.
- Watch the incision site for any redness, swelling or oozing. If this occurs contact Dr. Oursler or her staff immediately.
- Watch for any change in the color of her gums, they should be a nice pink tone. If at any time they become pale or white call immediately. This could mean that your dog is bleeding internally.
